About the Program

This Honours Bachelor of Health Administration program takes an interdisciplinary approach ensuring students receive and develop a breadth and depth of knowledge, skills, attitudes, and behaviours which are critical to the administration of complex healthcare systems. The program prepares students to tackle the needs and priorities for evidence-informed decision making, patient-centered care, health promotion, illness prevention, financial sustainability, and modern strategic leadership. Students in this program take part in experiential learning opportunities from their first year along with specialized courses in health informatics, cross-cultural and global health, program planning, health law, mediation, patient safety, research, innovation, management and leadership.

Scholarship opportunities are available if you have distinguished academic records from your high school careers. A variety of scholarships and bursaries are also available to you based on merit and financial needs.

Program and Course Delivery

This program is offered in Seneca's hybrid delivery format with some courses available in Seneca's flexible delivery format. Some coursework is online and some must be completed in person. Students will need to come on campus to complete in-person learning requirements. For courses offered in the flexible delivery format, professors use innovative learning spaces and technology to teach students in a classroom or lab and broadcast in real time to students attending remotely. In flexible courses, students have the choice of coming on campus or learning online.

Work Experience Mandatory Degree Work Term

A work experience that includes at least one term in a formal work environment. The work term(s) may be a paid or unpaid position that is completed between two academic semesters and requires a minimum of 420 hours of work. Students must be in good standing and meet all identified requirements prior to participating in the work experience. The successful completion of the work term(s) is required for graduation. Eligibility for participation does not guarantee that a work position will be secured. Additional fees are required for the mandatory degree work term regardless of success in securing a work position.

Program Learning Outcomes

- Critique financial and managerial concepts of public, non-profit and for-profit healthcare organizations to guide decision making.
- Analyze social, cultural, environmental, political and economic issues affecting healthcare to facilitate contextual strategic planning.
- Synthesize research to determine the economic and social impact of healthcare organizations.
- Allocate human, financial and information resources to assist in the management of operations and specific projects.
- Guide organizational strategic planning utilizing public policy.
- Model ethical, legal and professional codes of conduct in healthcare settings.
- Conduct research relevant to the field of healthcare management.
- Disseminate healthcare information for a variety of purposes and audiences, using verbal, written and digital communication strategies.

Admission Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, including six Grade 12 U or M courses with a minimum overall average of 65%, or a mature applicant (https://www.senecapolytechnic.ca/registrar/ canadian-applicants/admission-requirements/mature-applicants.html).
- Required courses with minimum final grade of 65% in each:
 - English: Grade 12 ENG4U
 - Mathematics: any Grade 12 U

Notes

After admission but prior to participating in your work term, you must obtain:

- valid Standard First Aid with CPR C certificate (two-day course)
- Police Vulnerable Sector Check
- · current medical and immunization report
- · current record of mask fit testing
