

FIREFIGHTER, PRE-SERVICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING (FFP)

About the Program

Are you interested in pursuing a career in firefighting? This 12-month certificate program prepares you for the challenges and rewards of a career as a firefighter or rescue specialist. Your studies will include fire ground operations, fire suppression, emergency medical responder (EMR) and fire investigation. You will also gain hands-on experiential learning in the areas of fire apparatus operation, technical rescue and hazardous materials

This program is accredited by the Ontario Fire Marshal's Office (OFM) and provides you with several National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) professional qualifications, as well as the professional knowledge and practical skills to work in the fire service field.

Graduates of this program have the option to transfer into the Fire Protection Engineering Technician (https://www.senecapolytechnic.ca/programs/fulltime/FPN.html) or Fire Protection Engineering Technology (https://www.senecapolytechnic.ca/programs/fulltime/FPT.html) programs.

This program is offered in person. Students are required to come on campus to attend classes.

Program Learning Outcomes

- Interact with others in various emergency and non-emergency situations with confidence, professionalism and sensitivity to others and to the circumstances.
- Communicate effectively, in a respectful manner, with various communities and their members.
- Use effective, appropriate problem-solving and decision-making skills in emergency and non-emergency situations.
- Work efficiently with the other members of the fire department team, providers of pre-hospital emergency care and other groups involved in providing emergency care to ensure a full range of services in emergency and non-emergency situations.

Admission Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), or equivalent, or a mature applicant (https://www.senecapolytechnic.ca/registrar/ canadian-applicants/admission-requirements/mature-applicants.html)
- Grade 12 English (C or U)
- Grade 12 Mathematics (c or U) or Grade 11 Functions (MCR3U) or equivalent
- Two additional grade 11 or 12 (C, M or U) courses, excluding co-op

Canadian citizens and permanent residents may satisfy the English and/ or mathematics requirements for this program through successful Seneca pre-admission testing. (https://www.senecapolytechnic.ca/registrar/ canadian-applicants/admission-requirements/mature-applicants.html)
